

Annual Report ~ 2023/2024

Waimea Country School's mission is to educate children to become confident, responsible, and compassionate people.



The WCS Board of Trustees appointed veteran teacher *Laurel Matsuda* Interim Head of School in April, 2023. With faculty and staff support, Laurel transitioned from Koa Lead Teacher, a position she'd held since 2006, to become the permanent Head of School in November, 2023. With her extensive experience, institutional knowledge, and significant contributions to developing and strengthening the culture of our school over the last 17 years, Laurel is uniquely qualified to lead WCS forward.



As Mrs. Matsuda transitioned from leading the 4th/5th multiage class to leading the school, Koa students benefited from working with a team of teachers who each brought their own expertise, gaining a feel for the middle school experience. Mrs. Matsuda and **Ms. Aceret** led the team for the first semester, and **Kelsi Johnson** joined WCS in January to become the lead Koa teacher. Ms. Kelsi is an experienced educator who has worked extensively both in Hawaii and on the mainland, including teaching 'Ohi'a and Koai'a students at WCS in 2021, enabling her to build on her positive relationships and prior experience to further students' learning. **Auntie Kelly** wielded her years of experience in the Koa class to maintain continuity through this transition. Curriculum highlights included learning about Polynesian voyaging, United States history and geography, and earth science, including the biennial trip to Hawaii Volcanoes National Park to explore up-close the effects of earthquakes and volcanism.







Team Koai'a - **Hannah Ediss** and **Auntie Jen** - led our 2nd/3rd multiage class through an exciting year of learning. They adapted lessons for student interests and circumstances - when students were enthralled by a crop of mushrooms that sprouted overnight, math turned into mushroom graphing and students exercised creativity writing about them. A student and his family taught about and shared their culture and heritage during the unit on Native Americans. Science Fair was a flurry of creativity as students used the engineering process to design toys, elevators, bubble machines, and marble coasters using simple machines.

Throughout it all, Koai'a students supported and encouraged each other.



'Ohi'a class thrived as **Kendra Powers** and **Auntie Didi** continued to provide tailored lessons to meet the individual needs of our K/1st students, challenging each child while allowing them to work at their own pace. Regular use of interactive activities such as science experiments, art projects, and math manipulatives kept learning relevant and concrete, and centers focusing on reading, writing, math, and fine motor skills ensured that students remained engaged while working on diverse tasks. Nature walks and outdoor exploration enhanced science lessons. Students celebrated individual and group successes - fostering a sense of community, promoting kindness and respect among peers, and cultivating a positive classroom culture.



In her second year as Reading Specialist, **Cindy Aceret** strengthened and expanded her support of literacy for all students, establishing a consistent program in the 'Ohi'a class, assisting with implementation of the Daily 5 in Koai'a class, and working one-on-one to support students in all classes, using multi-sensory language strategies to build literacy skills. 100% of 'Ohi'a students that were not reading at the beginning of the year were able to read consonant-vowel-consonant words in stories accurately by the end of the year, and students in all classes demonstrated increased skills and motivation to read.



Ms. Aceret also teaches music to the 'Ohi'a class, building connections that boost literacy. Learning rhythm, rhyming, and patterns in music, as well as practicing listening to and distinguishing sounds, all help children learn to read.
