WCS is a small, 'ohana school with a tight-knit family of educators. We have three multiage classes: 'Ohi'a (K/1st grade), Koai'a (2nd/3rd grades), and Koa (4th/5th grades). WCS families and volunteers are also key members of our learning community.

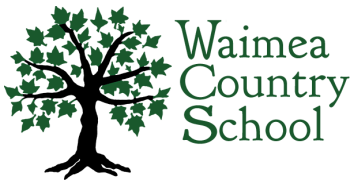
We are looking for a teacher who will embrace our mission and community and who aims to become a long-term member of our school 'ohana.

Qualifications:

- Bachelor's or higher degree in education or a related field
- Preferred: Hawai'i State Teaching License, OR comparable certification from another state
- Minimum of two years successful teaching experience, preferably at the upper elementary level

Specific requirements include the ability to:

- Design and implement curriculum in all subject areas to prepare students for success in middle school and beyond
- Employ a variety of instructional techniques and strategies, including differentiation, for reaching a wide range of student abilities and learning styles
- Assess student learning and baseline skills – both for modifying instruction as well as for reporting progress
- Manage a multiage classroom of up to 16 students, employing the basic principles of respect, responsibility, accountability, and compassion
- Work collaboratively with a small team on behalf of all students in the school; engage actively and positively in meetings and constructive problem solving when needed



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- Communicate effectively and professionally with fellow faculty, staff, and administration; and with parents as partners in their child's growth and development
- Demonstrate commitment to progressive pedagogy and continual learning and growth as an educator
- Represent the school in the community at large, including participation in school events held outside the school day
- Use technology effectively – for student instruction as well as for professional purposes
- Demonstrate professionalism through reliability, attention to detail, punctuality, respecting confidentiality, and embracing opportunities to learn and grow
- Write effectively for a variety of purposes
- Special consideration given to educators with:
 - Small school experience, particularly multiage philosophy and practice
 - Special skill sets or experience with (including, but not limited to) world languages and/or cultures, music, art, drama, gardening, Hawaiian culture, technology, etc.

The ideal situation would be someone who could start part time and move to full time at the beginning of the second semester in January for a smooth transition. There is some room for flexibility for the right candidate.
